We are writing to you about the plans for the Patient Classification Systems International (PCSI) General Assembly. As you are aware, we were unable to arrange our international conference this year. The General Assembly of the PCSI is a crucial part of annual conference where we announce changes in composition of Executive Committee, elect new members, report the financial position of the organisation and present our planned activities for the year to come. In the absence of the General Assembly this year, the Executive Committee has agreed to the following

- The annual membership of the organisation availed by members at the last conference (in Sydney) will be extended for a further year to the next conference (at no charge). This means that you will remain a member of the PCSI for another year.
- All current Executive Committee positions will be extended for an additional year. This means that the positions due to become vacant in 2018 will be recruited at the next conference in 2019, and the ones due to become vacant in 2019 will be recruited at the conference in 2020 and so on.
- The report on the financial position of the PCSI organisation will be circulated to members early in November.
- For any of these matters, members will be able to either contact PCSI via email or by attending a virtual Annual General Meeting (via GoToMeeting) to be scheduled within 10 days of issuing the report on the financial positions of the PCSI.

- At the same time, the PCSI members will be informed about planning for 2019 schools and for the annual international conference.
- Within two weeks of the issuing of the Financial position and assuming that no significant issues are raised by the PCSI members, the PCSI will adopt all motions and the General Assembly will be deemed closed for 2018.

# 4. Closing accounts and acceptance of the 2017 financial report

Paula Monteith (Treasurer) presented the accounts. She explained that the PCSI has four separate accounts: two in France (cheque and deposit accounts), one in Luxembourg (cheque account), and one in Canada (cheque account) but that this would change in 2018 based on a decision to consolidate the accounts.

At this point, Jean Marie Rodrigues suggested that meeting vote on the 2017 accounts. Brian McCarthy asked for people to vote and six members indicated that they were in favour of accepting the accounts. Brian McCarthy asked if anyone wanted to vote against accepting the accounts and there was no vote against accepting the accounts.

Paula continued giving more information on individual events in 2017 via tables 4-7. She outlined that there was no Advanced Principles School in 2017 so there was no income or expenditure. She indicated there was a profit from the Basic Principles school held in 2017. She indicated that the conference in Dublin (2016) made a profit and the final monies from this event had arrived in 2018. Finally, Paula indicated that there was a profit from the Sydney conference in 2017.

Jean Marie Rodrigues raised an issue with the schools that Basic Principles school participants were not able to enroll in the following Advanced school (in 2018). Brian McCarthy noted that the Advanced School was very popular and quickly reached the maximum number of students and this explained the issue with enrollment.
