Case Mix Summer School - June 2007

The PCSI and Service de Santé Publique et d'Information Médicale (France) successfully staged the 2007 International Case Mix Summer School in historical Avignon, France, the 11th to 15th of June. Continuing the previously successful summer schools held in Italy, this years' venue was the medieval Palais des Papes. Under the direction of Dr. Jean Marie Rodrigues (pictured centre) with assistance from Nathalie Durand, an internationally represented faculty reviewed case mix concepts, economic principles and incentives of case mix funding, case mix design, DRG analysis, international developments (and comparisons) and non-acute care case mix.



Research Corner

This volume's research focus is *inpatient psychiatric case mix*, which is often referred to mental health case mix.
