

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- Insurance Services
- Old State
- Providers submit financial/administrative transactions directly to payers
- Patient data is only in the Provider's EMR and cannot be shared
- Regulatory bodies have limited insight into transactions, and are challenged to enforce rules and regulations





- Insurance Services
- Current State
- Providers submit financial/administrative transactions to a single enterprise entity
- Physicians have a digital unified 360 view of patient health record including all encounters from facilities a patient has visited
- Regulatory bodies can set policies and monitor adherence across facilities and payers



Original Chapters modified, New Chapters added, Fully Compatible with Billing (IP/OP/Ambulance)




Saudibilling system
