- Allied health
- Assistance with functioning
- Rehabilitation
- Prevention and public health

In development since 2007

ICHI aims to provide a common tool for describing, reporting and analysing health interventions





Use cases for ICHI

- International comparisons
 - e.g. reporting by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) and Eurostat (European Statistical Office)
- Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and Universal Health Coverage (UHC) Specifying indicators, monitoring progress
- National use of ICHI
 - Countries with no classification of health interventions
 - Countries (other than the U.S.) which have used ICD-9-CM Volume 3
 - Countries which have a national classification and choose to redevelop it using ICHI
 - Addition of components of ICHI to national classifications
- Patient safety and quality
- Health System Performance Clinical, Case mix, Financial, Management
- Public health use cases for ICHI



Health intervention

A health intervention is an act performed for, with or on behalf of a person or population whose purpose is to assess, improve, maintain, promote or modify health, functioning or health conditions

- Each category is represented by a seven-character, pre-coordinated code, which is called a 'stem code'
- Each ICHI stem code is described in terms of three axes:
- Target entity on which the Action is carried out
- Action deed done by an actor to the Target
- Means processes and methods by which the Action is carried out

Chapter 22 - 27 arranged by ICF environment factors

4. Interventions on Health-related Behaviour

Chapter 28



Assistive products – including the Priority Assistive Products List (APL)

Quantifiers – e.g. number of performed interventions, inserted therapeutic products

Topology – e.g. relational, laterality, measurement

For 'Unplanned meniscoplasty of knee, right side', assign:

Stem code – MMD.ML.AA Meniscoplasty of knee

Additional descriptive information extension code – XB03.0 Unplanned intervention

Topology extension code for laterality – XK9K Right

SDG.RB.ZZ Practical support with carrying out daily routine **SDG.RC.ZZ** Emotional support for carrying out daily routine

Information, education and support as well as training in

carrying out simple or coordinated actions to plan and manage time and energy

and carry out the activities that are included in daily routines

throughout the day.

ICHI will make it possible to use more specific stem codes then in the KVÅ
